Recognizing that the North Grenville Public Library Board has a fundamental responsibility for upholding the principles of, as well as advocating for, intellectual freedom, this policy ensures the rights of individuals to access information.

- 1. It is the responsibility of the Board and library staff to do the following, while considering where there is the potential for harm to staff, patrons and the community:
 - ensure that library users have the fundamental right to have access to expressions of knowledge, creativity and intellectual activity, and to express their thoughts publicly
 - b. guarantee and facilitate access to expressions of knowledge and intellectual activity, including those which some elements of society may consider to be unconventional, unpopular or unacceptable
 - c. make available the library's public facilities and services to individuals and groups who need them
 - d. resist efforts to limit the exercise of these responsibilities, while recognizing the right of criticism by individuals and groups
- 2. The Board directs the Library CEO to ensure that the principles of intellectual freedom are integrated into all organizational policies, procedures and practices.
